Do you have YouTube, Vimeo and WordPress skills?

Over this summer, T4CG is building a new website. We need help curating video material on our new site. If you have relevant experience we want to hear from you!

We know our website is widely viewed and used by people from a variety of backgrounds but our video material is buried - on our new site we are setting up a section to have it all in one place.

This role would suit someone meticulous and reliable with proven ability in YouTube, Vimeo and WordPress platforms. You would be bringing video material into a prepared WordPress framework built by our web designer.

You will need to work to our brief. You will be supported by our web designer as needed via Skype.

This is a great opportunity to work as part of a small team and help to strengthen our ability to promote Common Good activity across the churches, business and civil society.

In this role you will learn about the principles and practice of the Common Good and help others to do so too.

Later, we may need help with managing a YouTube channel as well.

As part of the team you will have the chance to benefit from other opportunities as they arise.

Time required: negotiable, depending on your availability. Ideally the initial set up would be done over a few days during the summer. Subsequently, a regular role may be negotiated.
